Executive Director Letter

Dear Friends and Supporters,

It is amazing how quickly time flies by. The Bangor Area Homeless Shelter has been assisting community members experiencing homelessness for thirty-nine years already. I find it even more remarkable when people that our organization has helped throughout the years visit and share their testimonies about how the Shelter helped change their lives for the better. We also see many return to volunteer or donate because they want to give back.

In 2021, BAHS began offering Diversion services. Diversion works by problem solving with individuals who are seeking Emergency Shelter services to see if they have any alternatives available to a Shelter stay such as landlord/tenant mediation, helping with past due rent, or paying for a bus ticket to help reunite individuals experiencing homelessness with their natural supports who may be located in another area; just to name a few. In 2024, fifty households avoided becoming homeless because of this program.

Our Housing Manager has also been busy. A total of sixty-five individuals obtained safe, permanent housing through our Emergency Shelter Program. I am grateful to our staff, donors, and all the organizations who collaborate with BAHS to give community members a hand-up when they need it; it is life-changing.

Thank you for supporting our mission to address homelessness in our community. I am looking forward to another successful year of serving.


During the Year of 2024 BAHS provided Emergency Shelter to...

Financials

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, the Shelter received 53% of it's revenue from the support of community members, area businesses, and municipalities. The Shelter would not be successful without the dedication of it's staff and volunteers. The community support is ever apparent in the values presented in the annual financials. The Shelter was able to return 90% of overall support back into the life-changing programs such as the Warming Center and transitioning guests to stable housing. The Shelter continues to successfully run these programs and serve those at risk of homelessness and/or food insecurity within the community.
